AAUW 101: Early Branch history The Anacortes Branch of the American Association of University Women was chartered April 26, 1956 with twenty-two members. At that time, Membership rules stated that a member must have a minimum of a Baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university. At the first meeting, which took place in a member's home, it was stated that one of the main purposes was to keep its members informed on local, national, and international

affairs. They pledged to support the National AAUW Fellowship fund which provided scholarships for both national and international students. Their early fundraisers were children's plays and profits went to both National AAUW and to a girl graduating from Anacortes High School. Other early activities were a Mother/Daughter tea held at AHS for junior and senior girls – the speakers were recent graduates of Washington's five major colleges, with the purpose of encouraging the girls to attend college.

Chuck Williams, husband of long-time Anacortes AAUW member and former branch president *Marion Williams*, died on the 25th of June in Anacortes. He was 92. Marion and Chuck had been married for 70 years and he died the day after her birthday. After serving as a staff sergeant with the Marines during WWII, Chuck had a 33 year career in the Anacortes School District, serving as a teacher, coach, athletic director, vice principal and principal until his retirement in 1979. He was an accomplished builder and built the family home here in Anacortes. *The box our branch uses to store and display our name tags was built for us by Chuck Williams*.
