General Meeting Programs: We had a wonderful selection of speakers this year. Field Trips: We visited Chihuly Gardens and Glass in April.

General Scholarship: Our Branch scholarship committee selects the recipients that

allowed us to award 3 scholarships (\$2000, \$1000, \$600).

These are funded by our annual spring fundraiser: Donations can also be made to the Anacortes Schools Foundation – AAUW Scholarship fund.

STEM program: Teachers and principals selected the

recipients for our branch awards. We were able to award Science, Mathematics and Technology scholarships (\$500 each) to three 12th grade girls at our Washington State STEM Scholars Recognition presentation (certificates, pins, 4 GB USB drives with new AAUW logo that have information about AAUW on them). Our STEM speaker (Marine Biologist) was excellent. The

scholarships are funded by donations to the Anacortes Schools Foundation – AAUW STEM fund. We were able to award 2 Science, 2 Math and 1 Technology (new this year because of the new Robotics class) certificates to five 8th grade girls at

the Moving-Up ceremony at their middle school. They each receive a certificate and a \$100 achievement check. The awards are funded by donations to the Anacortes Schools Foundation – AAUW STEM fund.

> These girls are invited to the annual STEM meeting each year during their high school career and several of them have become our AAUW

State scholars since 2007 when the program began.

Teachers nominated 7th grade candidates that were later interviewed by Branch members for Tech Trek. We sent 3 campers: one was funded by Branch member donations, one funded by our

Anacortes Tesoro Refining and Marketing Company, and one funded by Tech Trek itself. We were thrilled! The 3 girls (pictured below) are scheduled to speak at our first general meeting in September.

LAF Fundraiser: A BBQ held in August was well attended and a lot of fun. We made more than \$600 to send to National. The donation will be made in memory of Ann Nord.

Website: We were pleased to get our website up and running. We have a webmaster that continues to do the updates. We have gotten several membership information emails from this.

Membership Drive: We set up a table at Saturday Market in Anacortes for two Saturdays in September. We got about 4 members from this and directed some other women to check out Branches in the areas where they live.

Community: We participated with the League of Women Voters sponsoring candidate forums. We presented a Writers' Forum held at the library in February, featuring Washington authors.







The International Relations group will resume their monthly meetings on September 24 with a discussion on NATO. The Great Decisions program highlights eight of the most thought-provoking foreign policy challenges facing Americans each year and provides background information, current data and policy options for each issue and serves as the focal text for discussion groups.
