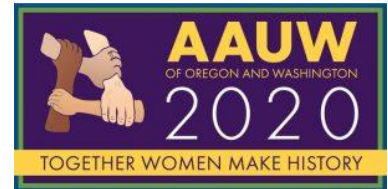

At camp, girls live in college dorms and take classes from an excellent group of female scientists. The camp is designed to create interest, excitement, and confidence in young women. We are in full swing, seeking nominations from teachers for girls to attend this camp. We are in contact with a number of schools; however, we find that teachers are overwhelmed and often need a boost to nominate girls for this great opportunity. The program is particularly focused to serve girls who might not otherwise be able to afford this kind of enrichment. We are hoping to send girls from Anacortes and throughout Skagit County to camp this summer.
