NATIONAL BYLAWS AMENDMENT

Seattle branch discussion groups about the upcoming vote on removing the educational requirement for membership.

**Group 1**: The group was in agreement that "the time has come" for this change – that it fits AAUW's mission (equity for all = membership for all). There was a little skepticism about whether this is a move to just increase membership, but AAUW does not expect much of an increase. Someone mentioned that they have felt "guilty" about being a member of an exclusionary, "elitist" organization. Two people shared stories about the knowledgeable people they have known who didn't have college degrees, and others said there were people aligned with our mission whom they wanted to invite to join but couldn't because of the education requirement. It was agreed that "education" means other things besides a college degree.

**Group 2**: A couple people strongly objected to AAUW's statement, "It's the right thing to do" because it implied that if you wanted to vote No, you were somehow "bad". It was commented that AAUW's image is one of snobbishness and exclusion, and that by opening up membership our image might improve, but only if AAUW makes itself more relevant to more people.

**Group 3**: There was a general feeling that we need to move forward in the spirit of inclusion, but there was also a sense of loss of the key educational element that has been the core of AAUW. There is the acknowledgment that not everyone has the same opportunity for higher education and that should not stand in the way of people joining us in the quest for gender equity. One positive we discussed is how the removal of a degree requirement eliminates what can be an awkward conversation with acquaintances who we think would be interested in AAUW but whose educational backgrounds are unknown to us. Someone mentioned that she hesitates inviting friends to AAUW events because she does not know if they have a degree.

Call to order: 7:01

Bonnie Underwood welcomed everyone to our AAUW March meeting. She announced that the Basket Raffle was postponed until next month and contributions can still be made for that drawing. The "Merman" fundraising project is progressing well and will be announced publicly in April. Most AAUW Board members will continue in their positions for next year, however, we are looking for two members to co-chair the Program Committee.

<u>Bonnie</u> announced that the AAUW meeting in April will include the STEM Awards for the High School and Middle School students and the speaker for that meeting will be Kelly Valentin.

<u>Nelle Jacobson</u> introduced Dr. Patsy Martin, who is the executive director of the Port of Skagit Valley. Dr. Martin, who has a background in geology, political science and environmental management, has served as Director of the Port since 2007.

<u>Dr. Martin</u> presented an overview of the businesses and activities that go on at the Port of Skagit, enhancing her presentation with numerous pictures of the area. She described the mission of the Port of Skagit as, "*Creating good well-paying jobs for the Skagit Valley*." Board members, who serve 6-year terms, are focused on creating economic growth for the area and supporting the businesses that contribute to that growth.

The Port is involved in many locations within Skagit County. The most obvious entity is the Skagit Regional Airport, which provides access to our area for many businesses as well as general aviation. Bayview Business Park includes a variety of businesses such as Viva Farms, WSU Extension projects (Bread Lab), and a beer making company. Other areas in the county with Port activities include the LaConner Marina and the Swift Center, which is located at the former hospital for mental health in Sedro-Woolley. We are also cooperating with Mt. Vernon to install the Fiber Optic Network. The Port operates with an \$11 million budget and has about 1500 employees. Dr. Martin answered several questions after her presentation and then left the meeting after thanking the group for the opportunity to tell people about her organization.

#### Other Items: Bonnie Underwood

- We are getting good feedback about our "Mermen" fundraising project. We need to find a large flatbed truck to use in the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade.
- Program Coordinator Board position: This position can be filled with two people who can work together to provide speakers for our meetings next year. We need volunteers to fill this position.

#### Tech Trek: Rosette Dawson

- Applicants are preparing their proposals and the teachers are very enthusiastic about getting their students involved.
- Rosette is working on getting sponsors for the girls from local businesses.
- The next AAUW meeting will be the Awards for STEM.
