What was it that caused a branch that at one time had over 100 members to let go of their mission? Here are some of the responses they offered:

"We have a core of about 15 members who participate in most things like our Tech Trek program and our Scholarships committees. Our branch meetings usually only have 20-25 participants, even before COVID19. So, realistically, we were heading towards dissolution eventually. No one wanted to work on anything that National was pushing, nor did they want to serve on any fundraising committees.

"As Kim Churches put it, ...younger women (and men) are either busy with jobs and families, and/or are not interested in joining a group of women who meet monthly to talk about things they don't particularly care about. This is a social media driven world and AAUW is trying to play catch-up...and it may be too late."

Meet Judy Higgins, AAUW Branch Secretary I was raised in Seattle through the elementary grades and went to Spokane for High School. Then I graduated from Washington State College (now WSU) in

1957 majoring in Sociology. I was married shortly after graduation to my first husband (Peter) who was from Pullman. The "best man" in that wedding was Bob Higgins! Peter was going into the Army so we moved to Texas for his first assignment. We later spent four years in Germany and when we came back we lived on the East Coast. By this time we had two children, both girls. We lived in Ann Arbor Michigan for several

years after Pete got out of the Army and moved back to Bainbridge Island in late 1970's. In 1980 we were divorced and I moved to Seattle. I worked in several jobs doing secretarial work and ended up as Administrative Secretary for the Director of the YWCA in Seattle. This was a great job for me and the first time I had worked in a social service agency. I retired from that position in 1997 after 13 years. My time then was spent enjoying my grandchildren and doing some travelling. I also volunteered at Woodland Park Zoo for 15 years and learned to play the recorder. In 2002 Bob lost his first wife to a heart problem and he and I renewed a friendship that we had first started in 1957. We have been married for 17 years at this point and have enjoyed living in Anacortes while also enjoying travelling around the world. Our blended family gets together frequently to celebrate our many interests and our lives.



STEM-Tech Trek Chair, Rosette Dawson was aided by Patricia Griffith, Linda Hendrick and Carolyn Colley as they interviewed girls on Zoom for our first virtual

Tech Trek camp this summer. Four girls from Anacortes Middle School, one from Edison Elementary, one from La Venture, one from La Conner and two that were planning to attend last year will all receive STEM boxes to guide them through their virtual camp experience. The kits each cost about \$500 and because we did not have camp last year, we had enough money with the addition of a \$1,500 Shell Oil grant to scholarship all nine girls. Fundraising must resume in order to fund camp for next year.

Not only do we receive support from our community, but there is a teacher at La Conner Middle School willing to spend the week at the school, July 11-16, with the La Conner girls. The camp director will provide her with the camp T-shirt and a Tool Kit. The school district is allowing this and paying that teacher for her time. Really wonderful.

At our April STEM presentations 3 senior girls received a STEM scholarship of \$1500 covered by funds in ASF-STEM fund. Additionally, four eighth graders were each awarded \$100 for excellence in Math and Science. These scholarships and awards have been funded by our Jingle Bell Dash which we plan to host again this year.

Rosette Dawson was our delegate at the AAUW-WA Annual Meeting and

Finance Report: Patricia Griffith

- There has been very little activity in the various AAUW Accounts. The checking account balance is \$4670.60 after payment of Natl/State Member Dues. Special Events Account balance is \$2128.91 and Savings Account balance is \$7731.04.
- Member renewal notices will be sent in mid-April.
- Finance Report approved.

Committee Reports:

- <u>Program Committee</u>: Discussion of people who might take over this position. Karen and Bonnie will follow up with those who were suggested.
 The Speaker for the May meeting will be Rakan Alderaij, who is a local photographer. Terri asked if he will receive an honorarium and yes, he will receive that.
- <u>Membership</u>: Linda Hendrick We have a potential new member. Linda will try to confirm this but suggested that she not pay dues for the remaining meetings this year.

- Scholarship: Barbara Benson
 We have received 5 completed applications and have recommendations for 3 other potential applicants. April 9 is the deadline for receipt of applications.
- <u>Fundraising</u>: Terri Bawden
 Terri checked on the <u>Tote Bag</u> supply at The Market. There were only 14 left. She talked with the new Manager of the store and he agreed to take 20 more.

<u>Mermen Project</u>: We have one entry so far. Flyers are ready for distribution to local newspapers, businesses, web site, and facebook. A flatbed truck suitable for our parade float has been located although it is still not certain that a 4th of July parade will actually occur.
