The **Anacortes Branch of AAUW** was chartered in 1956, and since its inception has been devoted to providing scholarships to local women and girls as well as educational programs and forums for the Anacortes community.

AAUW values and seeks a diverse membership. There shall be no barriers to full participation in this organization on the basis of gender, race, creed, age, sexual orientation, national origin, disability, or class.

Regular membership is available to anyone holding an associate or equivalent, baccalaureate, or higher degree from a qualified educational institution. Currently, annual dues for the national organization are \$62*, of which \$59 is tax deductible. Student Affiliation is available to undergraduate and degree-seeking graduate students attending a qualified educational institution. Student fees are \$18.81*

Who says fundraising can't be fun?


The Anacortes branch continues to seek new and fun ways for members to raise funds for scholarships and awards. We encourage members to attend monthly meetings and participate in all fundraising and membership events.

Tote bag sales continue to bring in revenue from local vendors. Attractive grocery-tote bags made from recycled plastic bottles are for sale at The Market and Johnny Picasso's for \$8. The bags feature full-color scenic photos from the Anacortes area and logos from business sponsor.



Our **Jingle Bell Dash** is a community 5K and 10K run or walk sponsored by the branch in December. The proceeds support **STEM** (Science,

Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) awards and scholarships for middle and high school girls. These awards are given in March based on recommendations made by AHS and AMS teachers.



In 2021 our branch initiated a new event for raising scholarship funds. The Mermen contest invited supporters to submit a merman photo to be included in a calendar, with winners riding on a float in the fourth of July parade.
